You are free...free indeed

On July 4, 1776, our founding fathers (George Washington, Samuel Adams, Thomas Jefferson, John Hancock and Benjamin Franklin, to name a few) signed the Declaration of Independence declaring this new nation's independence from England's royalty and subsequently England's rule. Within its contents, our founders expressed their intent to either alter and/or abolish the tyranny that held the then thirteen colonies captive. Their declaration to England's king adhered to the self evidentiary truths that all men are created equal, and that they are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable Rights, that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

Such inalienable rights were later described in 1789 as the First United States Congress drafted the Bill of Rights. They include the freedoms of religion, press, and speech as well as the right to peaceably assemble. These rights are preserved to protect the people of the United States.

While we may celebrate the freedoms promised to give us life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness, similarly we should commemorate the freedoms given us subsequent to Christ's crucifixion upon Calvary's Cross and His victory over death. For just as the founding fathers declared independence from the sternness of England's sovereignty, so too has God the Father issued His edict of freedom from the severity of sin's sting.

Freedom is at the heartbeat of the gospel message. The law that God had given to govern the lives of His creation ultimately became a curse because it concluded all under sin. (Galatians 3:22) Paul in his writings to the Church of Rome reminds us that the wages of sin is death.

Despite the condemnation of sin and for sin, Jesus declares in John 8:36 that if the Son makes you free, you



shall be free indeed. Paul reiterates and reinforces Jesus' declaration when he writes that "the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death," (Romans 8:2) "and that Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us." (Galatians 3:13)

This Independence Day, let us offer our thanks and praise unto God for the freedoms we have in His Son and our Savior—Christ Jesus.

Missions and Witness: Children's Disaster Services

"Carry one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ" (Gal. 6:2 NIV)

Along with the Brethren Disaster Services, the Children's Disaster Services and Material Resources are Church of the Brethren ministries located in New Windsor, Maryland.

Children's Disaster Services

Since 1980 Children's Disaster Services (CDS) has been meeting the needs of children by setting up child care centers in shelters and disaster assistance centers across the nation. Specially trained to respond to traumatized children, volunteers provide a calm, safe and reassuring presence in the midst of the chaos created storms, wildfires any natural or human caused disaster.

Volunteers from across the country participate in workshops, learning to work with children after a disaster. They are capable of mobilizing rapidly and responding both locally and nationally. Volunteers arrive to a disaster location with a "Kit of Comfort" (described by Joy Croston in the May Evangel) containing carefully selected toys that promote imaginative play. Volunteers give children individualized attention and encourage them to express themselves, thereby starting the healing process. Although many volunteers are motivated by faith, CDS' training is open to anyone over 18 years old. Through consultation or workshops specifically tailored to each situation, CDS also works with parents, community agencies, schools or others to help them understand and meet the special needs of children during or after a disaster.

In 2008, Children's Disaster Services provided assistance for ten disasters, using 143 volunteers, 1401 volunteer days/hours and serving 2,969 children. The Rapid Response Model is being used: people call New Windsor when there is a sudden need, and then given the OK to seek out the Red Cross shelters, assess the need for child care and offer services if needed. Meanwhile a call goes out for volunteers in the area that can help. Disasters last year where children's needs were met included two wildfires & the Metrolink train accident in California, the Indiana ice storm last December, as well as flooding, & hurricanes in a number of states.

There most certainly is a need for volunteers for either working to fix homes or working with children



in disasters. Last year CDS trained 151 people in twelve workshops. If you would like to be a volunteer for children's disaster services, consider attending a Level I workshop which usually lasts 27 hours and is an overnight event, with respondents frequently sleeping on cots, much like they would in a shelter during a disaster. Call CDS for information, 800-451-4407. There is a special need for men as volunteers; their presence is like magic for some children.

Material Resources

In order to collect and ship material resources to war-torn Europe after World War II, the Church of the Brethren established the Brethren Service Center in New Windsor. Over the years, staff at the Center have worked with denominational and private nonprofit organizations to help meet needs of people here in the U.S. and around the globe. At the Brethren Service Center, Material Resources staff inventories, packs and ships goods routinely, as well as during times of crisis. The full-time staff have developed extraordinary expertise in preparing goods for emergency shipment. Volunteers are a big help: last year 240 work groups and 1,596 volunteers helped package kits/quilts, blankets, and medical supplies, including hygiene kits to areas of need. In the earlier days of BVS, volunteers "earned their keep" by spending half of each day during training processing clothes.

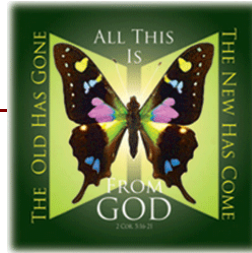

Annual Conference San Diego

Annual Conference this year is from June 26-30 in San Diego, CA. Annual Conference exists to unite, strengthen, & to equip the Church of the Brethren to follow Jesus. The moderator this year is David Shumate who grew up near Beckley, WV, and is now District Executive for the Virlina District in Roanoke, VA. Unfortunately, Eastwood will not be sending delegates to this conference because of the cost.

For over 250 years, Brethren have gathered regularly together to worship together, to discuss questions of faith, and to be reacquainted with believers across the country. The first official meeting for this type was in 1742 when Brethren met to reaffirm their unique identity. 30 years later, the event would become an annual occasion held during the observance of Pentecost, as an invitation for the Holy Spirit to once again come down upon the hearts and minds of these believers.

At Annual Conferences, Brethren have dealt with many practical questions of living out their faith. They've worked through many public issues such as war, death penalty, abortion, and environmental issues. And they have helped foster and develop the unique perspective of the Church of the Brethren.

Annual Conference is the highest and final legislative authority in the Church of the Brethren, including all matters of procedure, program, polity, and discipline. It is held annually in different geographical locations, chosen to bring the annual meeting into every area where Brethren have congregations. The authority of Conference has its source in the delegates elected by local congregations and districts, who come together as a deliberative body under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The voting body consists of two sets of delegates – those representing local congregations, and those from church districts, who also serve as the Standing Committee.

Annual Conference also hosts many non-delegates, family and friends of delegates, as well as others interested in the future and direction of the denomination. Worship services are central to conference activity. Business is conducted daily. In addition, educational activities are offered in the form of Insight Sessions, forums and exhibits of denominational programming agencies and related groups. Fellowship is enjoyed by all at events like organized breakfasts, lunches and dinners, informal ice cream socials, and at other times between conference activities. A full range of age group programming is

available for early childhood development, children's activities, junior high, senior high, young adults, and singles.

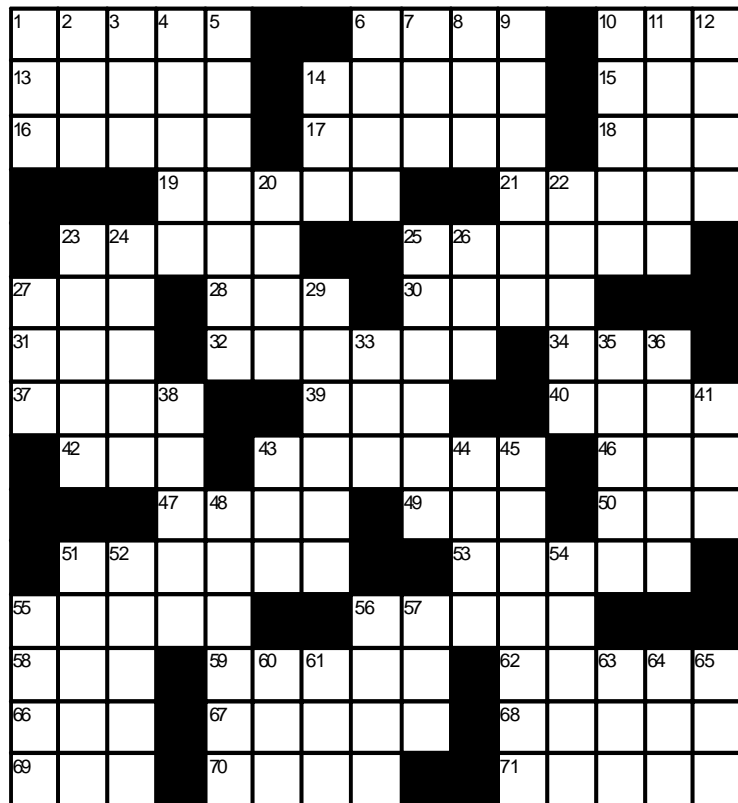
This year's conference deals with five items of new business:

- A statement of confession and commitment which addresses the issue of homosexuality as one that "continues to bring tension and division within our Body" & confesses, "We are not of one mind on this matter."
- The revision of the document for dealing with strongly controversial issues follows up on a decision of the 2002 Conference.
- Query: Language on Same-Sex Covenantal Relationships initiated by the Beacon Heights Church in Ft. Wayne, IN.
- Query: Secret Oath-Bound Societies initiated by the Dry Run Church in Pennsylvania.
- Revised bylaws for the church of the Brethren dealing with forming a new entity called Church of the Brethren, Inc.

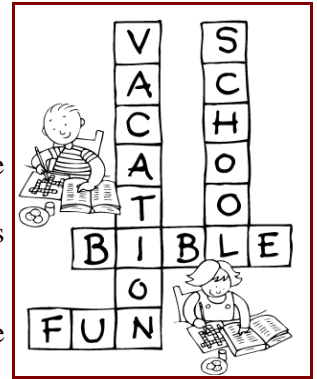

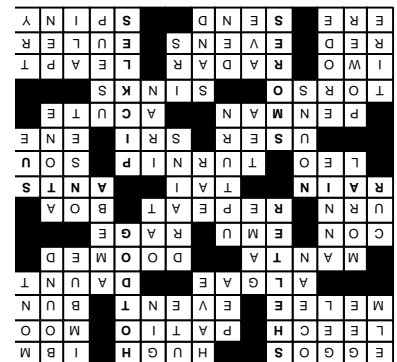
